## ORDINANCE NO. 2018-04-L&R

## AMENDING SECTION 303.06 OF THE GREENHILLS CODIFIED ORDINANCES REGARDING THE DEFINITION OF AN ABANDONED JUNK MOTOR VEHICLE

**WHEREAS,** Section 303.06 of the Greenhills Codified Ordinances defines an abandoned junk motor vehicle; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 4513.63 reflects updated fair market values and age parameters for junk vehicles and Village Council desires to have Village Code be consistent with the Ohio Revised Code;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Village of Greenhills, Ohio.

**SECTION 1.** That Section 303.06 of the Village of Greenhills Codified Ordinances is hereby amended as indicated below:

## 303.06 ABANDONED JUNK MOTOR VEHICLE DEFINED.

As used in Section 303.08 and 303.09. "abandoned junk motor vehicle" means any vehicle left on private property for more than seventy-two hours without the permission of the person having the right to possession of the property, or on a public street or other property open to the public for purposes of vehicular travel or parking, or upon or within the right of way of any road or street for seventy-two consecutive hours or longer without notification to the Chief of Police of the reasons for leaving the vehicle in such place, and that meets any combination of three of the following five requirements:

- (a) Five THREE years old or older;
- (b) Extensively damaged, such damages including but not limited to any of the following: a broken window or windshield, missing wheels, tires, motor or transmission;
- (c) Apparently inoperable or defective or missing parts or unable to move under its own power or in such condition generally as to be unfit for further use as a conveyance or in a dangerous condition;
- (d) Having a fair market value of <u>ONE THOUSAND FIVE</u> eight hundred dollars (\$800.00 \$1,500.00) or less; or
- (e) Does not display a valid license plate, or displays an expired license plate or validation sticker.

**SECTION 2.** That this ordinance shall be effective from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
